

INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

- [1] Scientific papers in the field of population studies are considered for publication in the **Turkish Journal of Population Studies**. The **Journal** is published annually, in December. Papers must be in English or in Turkish. Papers sent for publication should be original, unpublished work, and will be considered for publication on the understanding that they are not simultaneously considered for publication elsewhere.
- [2] Papers should be sent to Editor in electronic format with three printed copies before September 1. **Papers received after this date will not be considered for publication in the Journal for that year.**
- [3] Papers should be written in "single" spacing with font "Times New Roman" and size "12". A separate cover page should be sent with the paper, containing the following information: (i) the title of the paper; (ii) the name(s) and institutional affiliation(s) of the author(s); (iii) an abridged title for the paper, of not more than 2 or 3 words; (iv) an address; telephone and fax number and (if possible) e-mail address for correspondence.
- [4] The paper should begin with the title and the name(s) of the author(s). A short abstract, describing the scope of the study, should precede the introductory section of the paper. Tables and figures should be numbered consecutively. At most 4 "Keywords" and a "running title" at most 4 words should be put at the end of the paper.
- [5] Footnotes should be numbered consecutively throughout the text with superscript numerals. Footnotes should be placed at the end of the text, under the heading "NOTES", and not on the same sheet.
- [6] Appendices may be placed at the end of the main text, before the list of references. Capital letters should be used for appendices.
- [7] The list of references should be given at the end of the main text in the alphabetical order of the authors' surnames. For more than one work by the same author(s) in the same year, references should be ordered by using "a", "b", "c" after the year of publication. References should be in the following form:

Books :

Barclay, G.W. (1958a), **Techniques of Population Analysis**. New York: John Wiley and Sons.

Articles in periodicals :

Barrett, J.C. and Brass, W. (1974), "Systematic and Change Components in Fertility Measurement", **Population Studies**, 28(3), 473-493.

Contributions to Collective Works :

Peacock, A.T. (1963), "Theory of Population and Modern Economic Analysis", in J.J. Spengler and O.D. Duncan, (eds.), **Population Theory and Policy: Selected Readings**, New York: The Free Press of Glencoe.

References within text should take the form (Barclay, 1958a) or (Barrett and Brass, 1974) or (Barclay, 1958a; Peacock, 1963). For references with more than two authors, "et.al." should be used after the surname of the first author, as follows: (Brass et.al., 1980).

- [8] A short summary in Turkish, for papers in English, or a short summary in English, for papers in Turkish, should appear after the list of references.
- [9] All submitted papers will be reviewed initially by the editorial staff and, when judged appropriate, will be sent to not less than two referees for comments. Authors will receive information on the result of the evaluation of their papers not later than November 15. Wherever applicable, authors will be required to revise and return their papers to the Editor not later than December 1.
- [10] Ten reprints of each published paper and 3 copies of the Journal will be supplied free of charge to the author(s). Additional copies will be available at cost only.

Any manuscript that does not conform to the above instructions will be returned to the author(s) without any consideration for publication.
